HOW TO CONDUCT A MINI PUTT-A-THON FOR YOUR CHARITY FUND RAISER

- 1. Recruit volunteers to play in the Mini Putt-A-Thon, preferably 90.
- 2. Set a date with Tropical Breeze Fun Park at least 4 weeks in advance of your first meeting with the volunteers.
- 3. Call a meeting of your volunteers and distribute pledge cards to them. Also instruct them on sales presentations for example:

"I am participating in the Mini Putt-A-Thon for [The Girl Scouts of America] on Saturday, [May 15th] and would like to have you sponsor me."

- 4. Hold a progress meeting 2 weeks prior to the event and offer a prize to the volunteer with the most pledges. for example Tropical Breeze passes,-gift cards or t-shirts.
- 5. Hold the event and total the cards for each player. Award prizes for the best scores.
- 6. Have your volunteer collect the pledges and turn them into the organization within 2 weeks after the event.

REVENUE POTENTIAL EXAMPLE

100 participants (players) - solicit 12 pledges each = 1,200 pledges.

Each participant plays 18 holes and scores an average of:

A \$12.25 average per donor x 1,200 pledges = \$14,700

PLUS

Sponsors for each hole @ \$50.00 x 18 =

Total raised for the MINI-PUTT-A-THON = 15,600

Fundraising we reviewed the top 4 ways to help the community raise funds

- 1. Spirit night they arrive with a flyer for the fundraiser and we donate 10% back to the charity
- 2. Tickets/passes on concession you provide passes and let them keep 50% of the passes they sell
- 3. The putt-a-thon as described above
- 4. VIP/Loyalty/Fundraiser card similar to a store gift card where you can have the person select the charity they would like to support and the card stores the information you present a check once or twice a year to each group.

Remember this card also serves as your gift card/loyalty card/ mobile alert program/birthday/anniversary reward card.

It will also allow you to reward double points on slower days of the week
